

## Western Kentucky Youth Camp Announces Scholarship Winners

Zoe Stom will graduate from Calloway County High School. After graduation, she will attend Freed-Hardeman University, where she will pursue a degree in Elementary Education. Stom will play soccer for the Lady Lions this fall. She attends New Concord church of Christ.

“WKYC is dedicated to the development of our students into well-rounded Christians, and we had many excellent applicants who embodied that commitment. The selection process was very competitive,” said Vice President Dr. Landon Clark.

Criteria for selection include involvement with WKYC as campers and volunteers, strong academic performance, and participation in extracurricular activities and within their home congregations. The scholarship award is only applicable to attendance at a college or university affiliated with the churches of Christ.
